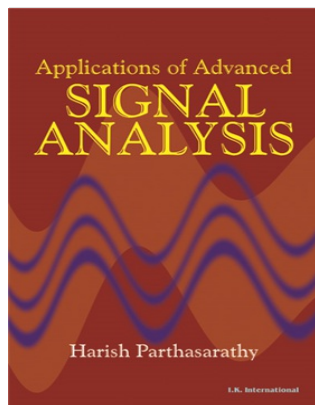

The mathematical tools used in signal analysis involve differential and difference equations, integral equations, matrix algebra and calculus, complex analysis and probability theory and random processes. Partial differential equations have been introduced here as an additional tool in signal analysis since they are used to describe quantum, electromagnetic and fluid dynamical phenomena not to forget Einstein's equations of gravitation.
